

Second Annual Church Shower

"Feed our People" was the theme of the 2nd Annual Church Shower and the gifts that poured in were over the top! Our congregation is simply the best!

Laura, Liz, Laurel, and Abbey want to thank you from the bottom of their hearts! The shower brought in all kinds of donations. We had socks, soap, protein bars, chips, fruit snacks, personal hygiene products, canned goods, bread, and about every type of cracker found in the stores. We knew that our congregation is amazing, but this, this was stupendous! The

party brought in \$190 in cash/checks and \$747.69 in food. Total: \$937.69. Attendance was 34.

Liz White is our church's liaison for the Backpack Program through the schools and we were able to load up 5 **very** large boxes of food for that program. It melted our hearts to see how many donations came in specific for that cause! The goal of the program is to send food home with about 30 special kids in school that may not get enough food to eat over the weekends. I would estimate that about \$250 raised on

Sunday went to that program. Thank you!

Dear Friends at Emmanuel,

When I was a young boy many of the names of the days during Holy Week had

me confused. I was alright with Palm Sunday—I got that. Palm Sunday was the day Jesus road into Jerusa

day Jesus road into Jerusalem on a donkey and the people shouted

"Hosanna" and put palm branches on the road as he came by.

Maundy Thursday was another matter. I always called it Monday Thursday and couldn't figure out why during Holy Week we would call Thursday Monday! I don't remember when I figured out it

was Maundy, not Monday probably when I was in Junior High

School. I'm ashamed to admit that it wasn't until my Seminary Days that I learned what the word "Maundy" meant or was all about. The English word "Maundy" most likely comes from the Latin "Maun datum" which means mandate. This would relate to the "mandate" Jesus gave his disciples at the Last Supper as recorded by John to "love one another as I have loved you" and to be servant people following his example of washing their feet. Okay, now that makes sense.

Now, what about Good Friday? As a young person I could not see any possible way that the day Jesus

was nailed to a cross could be good. I riday was taught that Jesus was the Son of God. He was a good and loving man. He even loved the little children. What could possibly be good about him being killed on a cross? What could possibly be good about him experiencing the most cruel and agonizing death

ever invented by human beings? My mind just couldn't get around that one. I remember reading in a book that the day Jesus died may have originally been referred to as "God's Friday." This was the day that God in Jesus acted to redeem the sinful world. Over time is got changed to

"Good Friday."

I don't know if this is totally true or not, but I kind of like it. The day Jesus died was certainly "God's Day"—the day God acted in a very dramatic may to show us the depth of God's love for us. As Martin Luther in his explanation to the second article of the Apostles' Creed says; that Jesus' death on the cross "has purchased and freed me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death. He has done all this in order that I may belong to him, live under him in his kingdom, and serve him in eternal righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as he is risen from the dead and lives and rules eternally." That day was certainly "God's Day" and for you and me with was also a very "Good Day". When you think about it, Good Friday worship should be the most attended worship service of the year. Without Good Friday there would be no Christmas and no Easter.

As we journey toward the last week of Lent, may that Holy Week fill us all again with the awe, joy and wonder of God's love for us. As we experience the mystery of that love poured out on Good Friday, may we be moved to a joyful celebration of God's grace as we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord on Easter morning.
