



Church Council Meeting Minutes – 12/12/2018 Submitted by Secretary: Brenda Emerick

The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by president, Meagan Malchow.

Members Present: Meagan, Brenda, Carol, Laurel,

Wade, Scott, Dawn and Pastor Mark **Members Absent:** Shane. Liz

Pastor showed a video with a Christmas devotion from Bishop Elizabeth Eaton.

Meeting Minutes: The November meeting minutes were approved as previously amended with a motion from Laurel and a second from Carol.

Treasurer's Report: Laurel provided the November Profit & Loss Statement, along with a YTD P&L statement. For the month of November, we are in the red with negative net income of (\$850.43). Our YTD net income is at \$15,771.52, but

this total includes the Memorial Funds and the Food Bank donations. Laurel has paid the parking lot loan in full. The Food Bank reimbursed the church general fund for the Food Bank electrical bills. The total amount raised for the Food Pantry during the recent Town Pump fund raising campaign totaled \$3,866.00. Town Pump is mailing the matching check for \$2,500.00 on December 14, 2018. Laurel was finally able to remove the second phone line that was on our Verizon statement that no one could account for. That saves \$40.00 per month. Laurel also reported that the propane was down to 1%, so she called for a refill. Rocky Mountain Propane from Huntley came out and went through the whole system. The filter was plugged, and we had some leakage. Laurel suggested that we try to keep the same propane company to provide consistency in service. The audit committee provided a letter to the council stating they met with Laurel on November 17, 2018, and found no discrepancies in any of the invoices, check register or checking accounts. The treasurer's report was approved with a motion from Scott and a second from Wade.

Deacons Report: The deacons had nothing new to report.

Trustees Report: Wade reported that when he was changing the ballasts in the alter area, he noticed there is a lot of debris that needs to be vacuumed out of the side lights. We need to find a vacuum with an attachment that can get into the small area to clean it

out. He also said that we need one additional leg for the ramp. Scott said that he has one, so they just need to find someone who can weld it on. Wade will work on the maintenance manual, as he is going off of the council after elections in January.

Old Business: The Ceiling Fundraiser was presented a couple of weeks ago by the kids. There is already a great response to the change jars. We will have to create a full report for presentation at the annual meeting in January. Since we are not going to actually do any work on the ceiling until after the money is raised, we do not expect any opposition to this new fund raising effort. The Eagle Scout project that the council approved to make a fire ring on church premises in memory of Tim Garcia has been completed. The Family Tree Services Christmas Tree sold for \$600.00 at the

Council she asked several people if they would consider serving on the church council. Linda Oberg said that she would. Meagan said that Ricker is considering it, as is Jill Hoffman. We will need 3 new council members and

one person to serve as the Vice President. The officer terms need to be staggered so that we maintain some continuity and don't have to have switch out all of the officers at once. We agreed to have the President and Treasurer renewals together and the Vice President and Secretary renewals together. While we completed Pastor Mark's evaluation at the last meeting, we did not discuss changing his salary. Meagan suggested that we give him the difference from the cost reduction in his insurance. Laurel will verify the amount and bring it to the next meeting for a vote. Pastor's housing allowance will go from \$10,000 to \$15,000 in 2019. This had been previously voted in.

New Business: We agreed to hold the annual meeting after church on January 27, 2019. We will have a potluck after church and conduct the meeting right after lunch. The agenda includes: Presentation of the ceiling project and fund raiser, the new updated constitution for the Endowment Fund, 2019 budget approval and voting in 4 new members to the council – one of whom will fulfil the newly created position of Vice President.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Mark attended his regular pastor meetings, text studies, Sr. Citizens meetings, and confirmation classes. He also performed a memorial service for Howard Osmundson. We have several church members who have trouble reading the small print in the hymnals and the bulletins. Pastor created a

3-ring binder that he inserted with enlarged copies of the bulletin and hymns for last Sunday. The one parishioner that used the binder was extremely grateful and stated that she could actually read the larger print. Pastor asked to be reimbursed from the memorial fund for 2 large print hymnals at a cost of \$80 each. He will use these to continue to make weekly binders for anyone needing the larger print. Scott so moved, and Carol seconded the motion.
