Our theme this year is the Montana Synod's second benchmark:


"Serve the World, Especially the Poor and those in Need:"

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. (John 3:16-17)

We will be able to articulate how everything that we do, everything that we advocate, everything that we commit time and money to will serve the world, remembering that the Gospel of John tells us that God so loved the world as to give Jesus, for the whole world. Through direct action, advocacy and cooperative work, we will minister to the poor, the poor in spirit, the forgotten and neglected. Realizing that this mission field is limitless,

we will encourage coalitions, cooperation and establishment of meaningful priorities.

In partnership with the ELCA Global Mission, we will explore different ways the gospel is being lived out across the globe. And we will look for ways to strengthen our global awareness and engagement. The Rev. Justin Eller, serving the ELCA as coordinator for Latin America out of Buenos Aires will be our keynote speaker. Justin and his wife Kari previously served in Bolivia, one of our companion synods. Tammy Jackson, the Program Director in Global Mission, will be our Churchwide Representative.



Dear Friends at Emmanuel.

The month of June marks another time of transition. On June 21st we transition from Spring to Summer. The recent rains we have received have finally jump-started the growing season. I

don't know about your lawn, but mine needs to be mowed about every four days! I hope it lasts.

The seasons of the Church year also make a transition this month. As we move into June (actually May 31st) we move from the Season of Easter to the Season of Pentecost—the Season of the Holy Spirit. Just as summer time is a season of growing, so the Pentecost season is also about growth—Spiritual growth.

I believe that sometimes we think about the months of summer as the time when the church goes into a partial hibernation. Sunday School is suspended until the fall. Many churches change their worship schedules sometimes moving the service time earlier to allow for more recreation time on Sunday and churches that normally have two services on Sunday mornings often cut back to one because attendance at worship drops during the summer months.

Of course, the church (that's us—we, the people are the church) does not go into any kind of hibernation at any time of the year. You see, there are always people who long to and need to hear the gospel and participate in the sacraments. There are always people who are sick and in need of healing and visitation. People die throughout the year and need to be comforted and accompanied in their grief. There are always people who need us to reach out to them with the good news of the Gospel through our words

and actions. While some of the church goes on. And thanks be to God that God's presence and support in our lives never take a break.

I would suggest that during the Pentecost Season (which actually goes until November) this season of growth, that we pay attention to our Spiritual gardens and growth, just as we attend to our lawns, gardens and fields—even in these summer months when church schedule may not be so busy. Here's some suggestions:

- If you are traveling or camping on the weekend, find a church where you are to worship. Worshiping in a new place can be enlightening and uplifting.
- Think about what needs to be attended to in your "Spiritual Garden" or "Spiritual Attic". What needs to be weeded out? What needs to be pruned? What needs to be cleaned out and taken to the dump?
- Think about what needs to be watered, nourished and nurtured.

I could go on, but hopefully you get my drift. If you need some help with any of these activities or if you need comfort and nurturing yourself, don't forget that your church (i.e. us—the fellowship of believers at Emmanuel) are here and we will be gathering around Word and Sacrament every Sunday—like usual.

God's blessings to each of you as you grow in your faith, trust and relationship with our Lord, Jesus this summer.

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING May 12, 2015

The Church Council met on Wednesday evening, May 13th, with 8 members present. Pastor Mark opened the meeting with devotions from "Reclaiming the 'L' Word". Pastor Mark had attended a meeting of the pastors the previous week where the agenda included discussion on the Evangelical Mission Strategy for the Billings with discussion around the question/ need for a new "mission" church? He also reported on the need for us to update our membership records; confirmation class for fall with a possible group of four students; he is also a corporate delegate with a three year term to Pacific Lutheran University; the Shepherd Staff, the church membership database, has been installed. He would like to have a


Council retreat for longer term planning in the fall with a gathering from 5:00 PM to 8:00PM on a Friday night and continuing on Saturday morning from 8:00 AM to noon. He asked Council members to look at their calendars so we can select a date. We also have a new family, the Malchow's, that have joined the congregation, and give them a hearty welcome. Pastor will be on vacation from June 15th to the 23rd, also June 29th, 30th and July 1st.

The Treasurer's financial report was discussed, and Jim motioned to accept it, seconded by Liz. Motion was carried.

Deacon's Report: Laurel Noland will help with the Family Promise program and the church calendar for weekly volunteers. Terri Hensley will help with the Community BBQ's this summer, and mentioned that Norm Haaland will donate the meat for those events. Terri also volunteered to help with the church garden, and put an ad in the Yellowstone Co. News to see if anyone wants to use a share of the garden space. She also suggested having a "church shower" in January or February to have

people bring items for needy families in the area.

Trustees Report: Matt had shared his thoughts regarding the garage remodel- to start with the garage, do a metal roof and soffit, and then possibly cover the entire building with metal siding. The interior needs to be divided with a partition and remodeled to handle the food pantry and storage. If we hear of anyone interested in the parsonage, contact him right away. The ELCA has some "World Hunger" grants, and we will research them to see if we'd qualify to receive help in preparing the garage for the food pantry. The Minutes from the previous meeting were accepted as printed.

Old Business: David Nelson reported on the Youth group: the spaghetti dinner and raffle brought in \$590.00 and was very successful. The BBQ's will be starting again on Wednesday evenings, beginning June 17, for the summer months from 6:00 to 7:00 PM. The garage sale date has been moved to June 6th, as there will be a number of garage sales throughout the area that day, and we will have more traffic. Jim made a motion to have the garage sale proceeds go to the Building Fund, seconded by David, motion carried.

Matt had drafted a letter on getting the "pledge" drive started again for the building fund. Kristianne will re-write the letter with more explanation in the introduction, etc. and our plan to communicate to the congregation this fall, by Harvest Dinner time.

The Council felt that we need to show some action on the garage, parsonage removal and parking area before we communicate this to the congregation.

New Business: The Synod Assembly agenda was not out at this time. One of the elected delegates



The Lutheran Center serves medical patients and their families with an affordable and comfortable home during their hospital stay or outpatient treatments. The house offers physical and emotional respite during stressful times.

The ranch style home has five guest rooms including one with a private bath. Common areas include a living room, dining room, kitchen, two full baths and family room. A chair lift is available for guests with limited mobility. Off street parking is available and laundry facilities are available free of charge. Guests are responsible for cooking their meals and cleaning their rooms at the end of their stay. Wireless internet is also available.

Board officers include a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. Emmanuel will be hosting Community Barbecues again this summer beginning on Wednesday, June 17th. The barbecues will be held every Wednesday evening through








