In *Whistling in the Dark* (HarperOne), Frederick Buechner compares Advent to the moments right before a symphony conductor raises the baton to begin a much-anticipated performance. "You hold your breath to listen," he writes. "You are aware of the beating of your heart. The extraordinary thing that is about to happen is matched only by the extraordinary moment just before it happens. Advent is the name of that moment."

During December, silence can seem elusive, Buechner admits. But "if you concentrate just for an instant, far off in the deeps somewhere you can feel the beating of your heart. For all its madness and lostness, not to mention your own, you can hear the world holding its breath."

The place where Jesus was born was under Roman occupation and they felt the harshness of that occupation. The lives of those living in Judea were neither easy nor peaceful. That is the world that Jesus was born into. That is the world that God chose to come to as a helpless baby. That is the world that God so dearly loved and wanted to redeem.

The hope is that God still loves this world and God is still working to redeem this world. There is hope and that hope is named Jesus! That is why, even in the midst of the violence of our world, we observe Advent and celebrate Christmas. Violence does not have the last word, God does. That is a word of forgiveness, love, peace and eternal hope—made flesh in Jesus.

You should have seen those reindeer go.


Then all the field mice loved him, As they shouted out with glee. "T.C. the Crazy Church Mouse, You'll go down in history."

# **CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING** November 11, 2015

Pastor Mark opened the meeting with devotions, with the theme "Meet the future boldly, dwelling in the love of Christ", from Ephesians 3: 14-21. Here we are, partnering together to deepen faith and to witness, and helping the needy. Pastor's report included officiating at one funeral, "Our House to the Synod House" project, a Thanksgiving Eve combined church service to be held here at 7:00PM, and the Christmas Eve service will be here at 8:00 PM. Also in his plan for worship, are two Advent services, one on Wednesday evening December 2<sup>nd</sup>, and the other on December 16<sup>th</sup>, which will feature the Holden Evening Prayer "Service of Light". Pastor Mark has ordered a new Advent wreath, as our old one is falling apart.

Shawn Seedhouse from Thrivent will be here on Dec.16<sup>th</sup> to speak to us also.

Secretary: The minutes were approved as printed.

Treasurer: We reviewed our financial Minutes performance year to date and Sharon will have the budget projections for December meeting. The insurance on the parsonage needs to be kept up until the building is moved out. We need to renew the internet fees. We are short in paying our benevolences, so may have to take some special offerings in December. The Food Pantry checking account has been funded by the garage sale, Sunday in the park, the summer BBQ monies, and the Ash Wednesday offering. Sharon will be updating signatories for our checking accounts given current Council membership. The Treasurer's report will be held for audit.

Council

Deacons Report: Liz reported on getting contributions from the Billings Food Bank which will probably occur every few months. Jim McKenney picks them up and brings them to Emmanuel. The Deacons are getting the wine for communion, and want to know what other duties need to be carried out.

Trustees Report: Jim McKenney has been working on the website for the church. He also discussed the need to relocate the food pantry from the church building into the garage, and the remodeling of the garage which needs to be done first. He will check with Matt concerning the building materials needed. Matt has purchased a used heating source for that area of the garage to be remodeled.

Kristianne reported on an effort by the FCCLA club at Shepherd School and her contact with Edie Vogel faculty sponsor. They will be providing healthy food for selected children in weekend "back packs". We are exploring how our food pantry can become involved in that project. Kristianne reviewed the revision to our "mission and vision" statement discussed at our fall retreat. Mission--to read

> "Emmanuel Lutheran is a welcoming church in a rural community called by God to joyful worship, caring relationships and loving service".....a motion to accept the re-wording was made by Sharon and seconded by Liz, and passed.

Church Our vision is "to follow God's plan for us to grow in faith, family, building and community", motion to accept made by Sharon, seconded by Laurel, motion passed.

> New Business: We talked about the Food Pantry use or mis-use, as the supplies are often emptied in just one day. Someone is coming in and totaling wiping out the supplies. The question was: "How do we watch and handle the amount people take at one time?" Do we need more communication? Do we need to have the pantry open only a few hours a day, and then have someone staff it while it is open. Laurel volunteered to make up signs regarding the amount of food taken at one time and encourage users to identify the number of people served as an initial effort to encourage desired behavior.

> Parsonage replacement: Do we need to remind people to give regularly over the next three years, to have funds available when the eventual replacement of the parsonage is needed? David will review the history on [Continued on page 5]

this topic, past congregational decisions and current considerations at the annual meeting.

As follow up to the Council retreat and the discussion regarding the need/desire for selected policies, the

Council reviewed the ELCA's social statement on human sexuality and the role for local congregations. How should we deal with this issue at Emmanuel Lutheran? It is up to the individual churches to decide whether their pastor should perform the marriage ceremony for same sex couples. How does our mission guide our decision—making? We will have a discussion and seek congregational feedback on this topic at the annual meeting

Dawn and Sharon agreed to serve on a Nominating Committee. They will seek 1-2 additional members to join them and identify a slate of individuals willing to serve on open Council positions and other church representation positions, i.e., Lutheran Center. Elections will be held at the Annual meeting.

The meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer. Our next meeting will be December 9th, and it will be our Christmas Party, so spouses will be attending also, and it will be held at Dawn Petty's home with a pot luck meal and brief meeting.




