Dear Friends at Emmanuel,

While browsing Facebook I can across a post lauding Oklahoma for a number of laws and amendments the state has supposedly passed defying Federal Government. The first action was that Oklahoma has passed

an amendment to place the Ten Commandments on the front entrance to the state capital. The last line of the paragraph said, "Hey this is a conservative state, based on Christian Values . . .!"

My first reaction was: is that so? Hum! It reminded me of a member of one of the former congregations I served. He was a businessman in the community and every customer received a business card sized copy of the Ten Commandments when they paid their bill. His reasoning? If people just follow the Ten Commandments we will become a moral community and nation again.

I don't think his passing out the Ten Commandments did much good. The community was still at least 40% unchurched. You could hear people taking God's name in vain on the streets and in the businesses every day. Attendance at worship was only about 20% (on a good Sunday) of the official membership of the congregation. Farmers still worked in their fields on Sundays. Children disobeyed their parents and Adults were not always respectful of people in authority, (teachers, police, etc.). There were plenty of burglaries in town. Every so often there were murders. Both men and women committed adultery on a regular basis—even among church members. Gossip was rampant and there was a goodly amount of coveting going on.

Passing out the Ten Commandment Cards didn't do much good, just as posting the Ten Commandments in front of state capital building and City Halls don't do much good. People still sin and our cities and country

have not become more moral. Posting the Ten Commandments in public places or passing an amendment to allow prayer in schools won't create good morals. I'm not saying that the Ten Commandments or prayer are a bad thing; I am saying that the only thing that can create an increase in moral behavior is a changed heart—and Jesus is the only one who can change the heart.

I believe that it is when we realize and incorporate into our lives the reality that God loves us, in spite of our sinfulness and that through Jesus God has wiped the slate of our sins clean—then our hearts are changed. It is then that we may start incorporating into our lives and behaviors the values of God's Kingdom. The apostle Paul lists a few of these values in Galatians 5: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, fidelity, gentleness and self-control. These are different than the values of the kingdoms of the world; hate, greed, jealousy, pride, conceit, and all the other things that the Ten Commandments urge us to avoid.

We don't need to post the Ten Commandments or pray in school, we need to allow Jesus to change us and start living by the values of God's Kingdom rather than living by the values of the kingdom's of the world.

**SECRETARY:** Minutes from June were approved as printed.

TREASURER: Motion was made to accept the financial report for June. Motion passed. Received \$400 more for the parking lot but still owe \$15,000. Talked about options and a motion was made to take out a commercial loan in order to pay off the parking lot. Motion carried. Any monies received for the Building Fund or the Parking Lot will be Minutes paid toward the loan. Will see change in budget as we will have to account for the loan payments. Sharon and Carol will handle getting the loan and checking on any other fees associated with the loan or early payoff. Will be adding reminders to the bulletin and newsletter requesting contributions. May also see some adjustments to the pension/health insurance for Pastor Mark for a couple months until things get adjusted now that Pastor Maryann has left her call.

Pastor is going to check on this to see if it will be ready to paint. Thrivent offers a kit for these work days that includes posters and debit card for \$250 to purchase supplies. Need to get request to Thrivent 21 days in advance. Liz will be bringing the cart back for groceries and back-toschool drive. Will be doing a Backpack Blessing

on August 21 during worship for all of the kiddos going back to or starting school. Include reminder in Newsletter and bulletin prior to this event.

**TRUSTEES:** Matt presented information and a bid for the line painting in the new parking lot. A motion was made to approve the line painting and the bid received. Motion carried. Matt & Melissa are donating the funds to get the painting done. Thank you!!! Workday on July 23 starting at 8am. Many things to do: saw cuts in the parking lot need to be caulked, sealant needs to be sprayed over the concrete (all supplies in the garage to complete this), church foundation needs to be painted, freezer needs to be picked up from Bill Green's place, Girl Scouts will be painting the ramp, and if the doors for the "new" pantry come in, they will need to be installed. Brianne Malchow needs a project for Girl Scouts

and would like to take on completing the swing set area by putting in the rubber boundary and small pebbles as well as repainting the swing set. Discussion of putting in a French drain from behind the garage out to the road but it was tabled at this time as we want to see how it drains before making any decisions.

**PASTOR:** Has been busy with Senior Citizen group, a baptism for the Joe Lockwood family, St Johns Worship, had a final premarital meeting, and God & Family Award w/James Malchow.

Community BBQs have been well attended. Will be having the Council Retreat on 9/16 & 9/17. Might see if we can do the Friday evening portion at the Community Center and finish up Saturday morning at the church.
