


Christmas Program 2017

Since then I have occasionally thought of other words I could have put in if I'd had my wits about me, and they are the ones that fill these pages. I used up almost all of the overtly theological ones the first time around so most of these are just plan words which I've tried to say something more or less theological about."

As I was doing my new year reflections I remembered that he wrote about the word **TODAY** in that book and I'd like to share it with you.

It is a moment of light surrounded on all sides

by darkness and oblivion. In the entire history of the universe, let alone in your own history, there has never been another just like it and there will never be another just like it again. It is the point to which all your yesterdays have been leading since the hour of your birth. It is the point from which all your tomorrows will proceed until the

hour of your death. If you were aware of how precious it is, you could hardly live through it. Unless the are aware of how precious it is, you can hardly be said to be living at all.

"This is the day which the lord had made," says the 118th Psalm. "Let us rejoice and be glad in it." Or weep and be sad in it for that matter.

The point is to see it for what it is because it will be gone before you know it. If you waste it, it is your life that you're wasting. If you look the other way, it may the moment you've been waiting for always that you're missing.

All other days have either disappeared into darkness and oblivion or not yet emerged from it. Today is the only day there is.

May God bless each of you and each of your *Todays* as you journey through this year of our Lord, 2018!


me! At the end of the day when I'm walking away

Randy is also going to check the fire extinguishers that we have and make sure we get them up to code. Wade was not present so unsure what he has determined for the sign board on the door. Will check with him next month. A friend of Dawn's is moving to assisted living and has a refrigerator, chest freezer, and range that she would like to give to us. Kristianne will check the rate for a small storage unit until we have a chance to organize our storage unit or get them to someone who needs them.

NEW BUSINESS: Looking at possibly having a membership orientation/class to go over what is required to be a member of ELC for those that are not sure or for new people interested. More


to come on this at a later date. Maryann changed the sign in the front yard. This sign is falling apart, and we will need to look in to replacing it in the future.


