CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

7/11/18 – submitted by Secretary: Brenda Emerick

The meeting was called to order at 7:15pm by president, Meagan Malchow.

Members Present: Meagan, Scott, Brenda, Liz, Carol, Dawn, Laurel and Pastor Mark.

Members Absent: Wade, Shane

As trustee, Scott had to leave early, we moved the agenda item of the work day to the beginning of the meeting. The work day is set for Saturday, July 21st from 8:00am - 12:00noon. Scott and Shane will power wash the parking lot and foundation on Monday, 7/16/18 at 6:00pm. This will allow adequate dry time prior to sealing and painting. Dawn Petty volun-

teered to purchase the gray paint for the foundation. Meagan will let her know to buy 2 gallons. Meagan will buy 4 gallons of red paint for the ramp. landscape timbers. and play set. The boy scouts and any

other volunteers will begin painting the red paint areas on Wednesday, July 18th. Pastor reported that Laurel V. had volunteered to bring railroad ties to replace the landscape timbers. The council agreed to keep the current timbers since the plan is to put in cement curbs next year. Meagan will let Laurel know.

Pastor led a devotion.

Meeting Minutes: The June minutes were approved as written with a motion from Carol and a second from Laurel.

Treasurer's Report: Laurel provided the June Profit & Loss Statement, along with a 6 month profit & loss and a 6 month summary showing a net loss for each month from January through June. For the year, we are \$9,360.36 behind budget. This shortfall is after adding the full income from the garage sale of \$1,633.82 to the general fund, along with \$6,985.00 from the memorials from the Green family. We have had to borrow from the memorial fund to pay bills and the general fund now owes the memorial fund \$3,000. The food pantry ran short in February and April, so the general fund was used to cover those shortfalls for a total of \$1,450.00. We have not had any unexpected expenses so far beyond propane. We budgeted \$2,000 for the year, and have already

exceeded that by \$221.10. That line item will continue to be above budget. Once we obtain 501 C3 designation for the Food Pantry, we will be able to obtain funding for it which will relieve the general fund from helping out as needed. We will also save on propane and electricity. The balance on the parking lot loan is down to \$3,528.96. That will be paid off by December. Brad Sherseth obtained a check for \$5,000 for the food pantry. Brenda moved to reimburse the general fund from that check for the \$1,450.00 that was given to the Food Pantry earlier. Dawn seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. That still leaves a very healthy sum which should easily tide the pantry over for months to come. The treasurer's report was approved with a motion from Brenda and a second from Carol.



Deacons Report: Dawn reported **Council** that we are low on communion wine. She stated that Ricker has volunteered to bring some chokecherry wine that he made. The council agreed to try it. Liz read a

letter from Town Pump. They have invited us to participate in a Food Pantry fund raiser from September 1 – November 30, 2018. If we can raise \$2,500, they will give us matching funds. The council discussed some fund raising ideas. Pastor suggested that we invite the Huntley Methodist church and UCC to join with us in our fund raising efforts. Liz is also working on a stewardship letter to be sent out next month.

Trustees Report: As no trustees were in attendance at this point, there was no discussion.

Old Business: Scott and his office volunteered their time to complete the paperwork for the 503(C) designation for the food pantry. Meagan will be sending it all in tomorrow. The first harvest from the garden is going into the food pantry tonight. Meagan is working on an ELCA foodbank grant. After the water lines for the garden have been installed, the painting and parking lot sealing have been completed, Meagan would like to have a couple of signs made for the Food Pantry and community garden. When these are complete, she will invite the TV and newspaper folks out to promote our food pantry and church.

Pastor's Report: Pastor has attended pastor

meetings and has begun preparing for confirmation this fall. He stated that the community barbecues are going well and have had good attendance. He had a trip to Stevensville and one to Rapid City. He has been invited back to Nebraska to help celebrate the 125^{th} anniversary of his church there. He will be gone from August 3 – 6, 2018. Since that weekend is the Barkemeyer Park church service, we will not need to find a stand in for the Sunday service. We may need someone to volunteer to read on Aug. 5th at the park service. Pastor requested ideas for our "God's work, our hands" community volunteer day on September 9th.

New Business: We discussed trying to add some special music back into the services. It's always good to have kids participate, and to have congregation members share their musical talents. Meagan will encourage some of the new band students to prepare some music for during offering and/or communion.
