Church Council Meeting Minutes – 2/6/2019 Submitted by Secretary: Brenda Emerick

The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by president, Meagan Malchow.

Members Present: Meagan, Brenda, Ricker, Laurel, Linda, Dawn, Jill, Liz and Pastor Mark **Members Absent:** Patty, Scott

Pastor presented the devotion and the meeting began with a prayer.

Meeting Minutes: The January meeting minutes were read and approved as written with a motion from Liz and a second from Dawn.

Treasurer's Report: Laurel provided the January Profit & Loss Statement. For the month of January, we were in the black with net income of \$4,352.53. However, this includes \$1,065.02 for the Raise the Roof Campaign, \$4,913.82 for the Shepherd Area Food Bank and \$1,680.00 for Memorials. None of these funds can be used for general church expenses. Removing these income items from the report leaves us in the red at -\$3,306.31. The treasurer's report was approved with a motion from Brenda and a second from Jill.

Old Business: Jill reported that she met with representatives from Tetratech at the church this past Monday. They will provide a bid by the end of this week for testing our ceilings for asbestos. This needs to be done in advance of performing the ceiling improvements. Even though the current plan is to simply cover up the existing tiles, we will need to open some up to get to the electrical wiring. Members of the council gave Meagan some additional names of potential contractors to obtain additional bids from, per the congregation's request at the annual meeting. These included Paul Ferguson, Shawn Maddox, and Mark Beeler.

New Business: Meagan requested ideas/ suggestions for projects to be completed in the coming year. Ricker pointed out that while we have a ramp and a stair lift to accommodate wheelchair bound visitors, our doorways are not wide enough to allow a wheelchair to access our bathrooms. He suggested that we widen the doorway to the bathrooms, and each bathroom door. We will ask the contractors who are bidding our ceiling work to also bid this accessibility project. We had Clint McCaffree look at welding a section of the wheelchair ramp to make it sturdier. Ricker suggested that we may be able to accomplish the task with some steel tubing and self-tapping screws. If the welding option is not feasible, we will try Ricker's suggestion. We still need to caulk the seams in the parking lot. We also need to replace the canopy on the playground equipment and we plan to have the cement curbing installed around the church this spring. Another topic of New Business was a "Giving Back to Our Community" suggestion from James Malchow as presented by



Meagan. He thought we should collect sleeping bags, coats, gloves, hats and socks and donate them to HUB in Billings. The council suggested that we should look into this collection effort, but check with the Shepherd School to determine if we have youth/families in the Shepherd area that could benefit from these items. If so, we will give them the donations. If

there is not a need, or a way to distribute the items locally, we will then give them to the HUB. We do not have room in the Food Pantry for clothing, and when we have allowed clothing donations in the past, many items were not usable. We discussed having a council retreat. This would allow us to bond together. but also learn more about our ministry opportunities, as well as more fully flesh out long term church goals. The retreat is scheduled for Friday night, April 5 from 6:30-9:00pm at Brenda's house. We will reconvene on Saturday morning, April 6th at the church from 8:30am – 12:00noon. Jill Hoffman, on behalf of the Shepherd Community Education Committee requested to have this group come to the fellowship hour after church one Sunday to discuss the bond issue coming up on May 7th. Jill moved and Liz seconded the motion to allow this outreach to occur. Motion carried. Jill requested that the church council fund the (4) four confirmation kids' trip to Christikon this summer. Pastor stated that the ladies' group raises funds for just this type of request. He suggested that Jill speak with Dawn Petty to verify the process of applying for scholarships to Christikon. Laurel also stated that our budget has funds for Youth

projects that could be put towards this as well, if needed. With the new constitution, the council is now required to appoint the Sunday School Leader and the Financial Secretary. These are no longer elected positions. Laurel moved to retain Jill Hoffman as the Sunday School Leader, and Abbey Emmons as the Financial Secretary. Dawn seconded the motion and it passed. Finally, Pastor presented the list of monthly Benevolence Offerings. We need to remove the Shepherd Area Food Pantry from November, since it is now able to obtain grant money. A few suggestions were brought forward, but the council agreed to table our final decision until the next meeting. This will give us time to do some research to find a local need.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Mark attended his regular pastor meetings, text studies, and Sr. Citizens meetings. The confirmation classes have restarted, but Sundays are proving a little difficult with students being involved in sports that have weekend tournaments. Pastor performed one home communion, and attended the endowment committee meeting last week. The committee awarded college scholarships to Brianne Malchow and Melissa Sherseth. Pastor Mark attended the Shepherd area pastors' meeting to plan the Passion season services. Ash Wednesday is March 6th and services will be at Huntley Methodist Church. We will have our traditional Seder Supper on Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday services will be in Ballantine. Dawn Petty has volunteered to once again host the Lent services at her home. Pastor is on vacation the afternoon of February 8 – 18, 2019. His church services will be covered by Dawn Petty. Pastor will have foot surgery on February 28th. He will need a volunteer to run off the church bulletins, as it will be difficult to get into the church basement with crutches. He will attempt to preach the church services, but will need someone else to give communion due to the step situation.

Mission Cornerstone: Liz will speak about our community outreach effort to collect sleeping bags, coats, gloves, hats and socks for donation to a group to be determined. She will also get the word out about a volunteer to help with the bulletins.


