

ELC Council Meeting 3/17/2020

<u>Secretary's report</u> from February was approved as previously read by Dawn and seconded by Robin. Motion carried <u>Treasure's report</u> was reviewed. Linda motioned to approve,

Scott seconded, motion carried.

Call committee report

Liz contacted Kristianne for any updates. There is not much to share. Pastor Asselstine prepared us for a several month process. Given our budget for pastor compensation, he felt it was unlikely a new graduate would relocate for a first call position. Therefore he is anticipating finding a congregation partner to share a position.

Old business

Construction updates

-Windows installation on the west side of the building has been completed. BSE is working on insurance paperwork for us to get matching windows on the east side.

Members met with BSE to discuss construction plans and do a walk through. Several things came from that walkthrough. I've added highlights of that meeting below.

-Voted for 4" siding vs 8" vs. keeping it the exact same (a combination of both)

-Note: This will not include the "fan" decal above the doors or windows. BSED stated that it was a custom made job and would be very costly and need more upkeep (painting, color matching, etc)

-Voted to pay \$600 to have the stain glass window wrapped with metal trim. This will keep us from having to paint the trim.

We requested separate bids for the following: all remaining windows and wrap to match new windows, metal wrap for the handicap door as the current wooden trim is starting to rot, replacement of the west side door that leads to the basement equipment room, and replacement of all four blue doors

We also discussed the bell tower and it's needs. Phil White requested they remove the louvers for us to fix. This would be a liability risk for BSED and they would be responsible for them if they were rotted or falling apart. BSED will make a bid for the louvers.

Todd with BSE brought the following bids to the meeting (window bids include metal wrap that will match new windows already replaced)

Window off the bathrooms 4949.00

Office windows (4 total) \$1,013 each (\$4,052 total)

Picture window right of front entry \$901

Picture window above side door, and left of front entry \$938.35, (\$1,876.70)

Wrapping the stained glass exterior \$600 (this was voted on at construction meeting and will be done)

Steeple vents: These will be slightly different. They will be squared off, not arched like current. The new ones will also include a screen backing. 4 each @ \$1575 = \$6,300

* Note, if we do this, the louvers will not come in before the siding is finished. BSE will reserve receiving payment for \$1,000 to finish this at a later date.

-There are several more bids to come for the doors at a later

Discussion was had regarding the bids and how best to proceed. Ricker with a second from Scott motioned to postpone the replacement of the windows until we know more about our financial situation and can acquire several more bids. This motion passed. Ricker will reach out to Windor for another bid for the remaining windows. Ricker and Phil White had previously discussed either renting or borrowing a bucket ladder to remove and fix the louvers ourselves during a work day. Scott made a motion that we do this steeple work ourselves, with a second from Laurel, motion carried. Ricker will look for replacement bids for the

west side equipment door that we can install ourselves. Siding- Siding removal began 3/13. Construction crew will work Monday through Saturday, weather depending. Estimated time to completion is 3-4 weeks.

If there are any issues during construction, we are to go through project manager Kyle Pugh, not the workers themselves.

The following have been tabled until the siding has been completed and the weather warms up: gutters, roof, carpeting. Dave Hoffman has contacted Guide One for an extension for the completion of all construction, which has been granted.

<u>Lay Pastor Update</u>- moved to new business following the COVID-19 discussion

<u>Music Committee</u>- chaired by Scott Green and includes Dawn Sherseth, Kristianne Wilson, and Sharon Wolske. Craigslist application was submitted for a musician that can play both traditional and contemporary style church music. No inquiries were had. Mrs. Armond Lohoff interviewed a pianist for us that did not work out. We will table the music committee until life is back to normal.

<u>Alter Railing-</u> is done and installed. Thank you letter sent to Shepherd Stainless for doing the work.

<u>Keys</u> needed for council members include: Robin, Scott, Patty, and Ricker

Computer Installation- The new computer is up and running and working great! Thanks, Jim McKenney for assisting in this. We will table discussion on what to do with the old computer for now.

New Business Covid 19 Guidelines

Meagan spoke to the current Billings process for patients if they think they may have viral symptoms.

If you feel like you have symptoms, call your primary care provider or the phone number on the hospitals' website. You will be asked a series of questions and the nurse will triage you to where you need to go, whether it be proceeding to a testing site or not.

As far as church services go, we will follow the CDC guidelines, which is what the Montana Synod recommends. This recommendation is that no more than 10 people shall gather together and be closer than 6 feet apart. We will follow a rolling 2 week schedule where we will reevaluate after the two weeks. Therefore we will not have any church or Lenten services through April 1st. The council will meet prior to this and decide whether we will reconvene. This motion was made by Meagan and seconded by Liz, motion carried. Linda will email John Hanson, Liz will email Armond Lohoff, Laurel will call Laura, and Ricker will notify Dawn of the cancellations. Liz and Jill will draft an email to go to the prayer line email list and newsletter list regarding this information. Cleaning bids-Liz and Meagan are working to find a replacement cleaning lady as Kelly Mack can no longer clean for us. Liz contacted several known cleaning ladies in the Billings and Shepherd area that she found on Facebook and from word of mouth. None came to fruition. Meagan contacted several cleaning companies with one response from I Dream Of Jenny's Cleaning Service. We met with Jenny and her husband at the church for a walkthrough. Dawn Petty, Meagan, and Liz were present. Her bid is \$195.00 for biweekly cleaning, which is 390.00 per month, with additional hours spent on extras (like exterior windows) will be \$25.00 per man hour. Jenny is licensed and bonded, with good references. We voted to give Jenny a month trial starting April 1st. This motion was made by Meagan and seconded by Dawn. Meagan will contact Jenny.

Second collections- We discussed restarting our special offerings. A motion was made by Meagan to start in June and go to the end of the year. They will be as follows: June- Freedom in Christ Ministry, July- Family Promise, August- Lutheran Social Services, September- Christikon Lutheran Bible Camp, October-Raise the Roof, November- Campus Ministries, December- St John's United. This was seconded by Linda, motion passed. We (continued on page 5)

Liz will reach out to Louie and Rachele Garcia to check on the current Food Pantry status. Liz and Jill will include in their letter to the congregation, who to reach out to if anyone knows of needs in the community we can help with. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer and a motion by Meagan, seconded by Scott, motion carried.

She also said her two brothers who work for Boeing have also been exposed and have been quarantined, they are in Washington state. Bob Fritz is doing much better and back to normal, and at home.
