We invite you to join us online. This is a great alternative if you are uncomfortable joining in person or you might be in a compromised or vulnerable situation.



Secretary's report

Everyone has read the minutes to the September meeting. Meagan made a motion to approve the amended minutes and Dawn seconded. The motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's report</u>

The treasurer's report was reviewed. Laurel stated our monthly average income has been \$6,273 per month, which is a little under budget for the year, but given the pandemic restrictions, we're still doing well. We are consistently and steadily receiving weekly checks by mail. Liz made a motion to approve the treasurer's

report for September, Dawn seconded, motion passed. Of note, we have received two letters from different organizations. The Northern Rockies Institute of Theology and ELC World Hunger have written asking for donations. Patty made a motion to give \$250 to each of these entities as we did with each of our monthly special offerings as they are surely suffering during these times. We will add these organizations to our list of monthly special offerings to review and consider for the 2021 year.

Call committee report

Several members of the call committee and council met with Pastor Asselstine and Pastor Kristi Bummer, an interim pastor who lives in Billings and is looking for part time work. Discussions went well. Call committee chair Kristianne Wilson joined us for our meeting as we discussed our congregational needs. Meagan, Kristianne, and Liz will meet to draft a contract for Pastor Bummer to review. Requests for the contract include: Sunday service including bulletins, adult bible study, once a month youth activities, and congregational support keeping with Covid 19 guidelines. The discussion was to have a three month contract and then reevaluate how things are going.

OLD BUSINESS

Construction

Discussion was had regarding the furnace room door that leads up the stairs and out on the west side of the church. Ricker looked into getting a replacement door, but found it would need to be custom made due to its size. The decision was made to temperature seal it for the winter and look into options in the spring.

Work day Liz will continue to keep the chore list updated as things are added and completed. She will submit an pdated list for the November newsletter.



Covid 19 update The council discussed the new Yellowstone County restrictions and our current practices as a congregation for Sunday services. It was decided that we are well within the new guidelines and will continue to have services, encouraging people to wear their

masks, sit in their family units, and sanitize their hands upon entering the sanctuary.

<u>Lay Pastor Update</u> Liz is continuing to fill the schedule through the end of November. Updates will be made to the schedule on the working Google spreadsheet.

New Business Meagan brought to the attention of the council that there are several Boy Scouts who will be needing eagle scout projects. Some ideas they had were landscaping around the church in the spring, making one of our bathrooms handicapped accessible, and making a new and updated sign for the church.
