

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

June 9th, 2021, 7:00 PM

The meeting was opened by President Jill Hoffman. The first item on the agenda was a report by Greg Plath, regarding the progress on the louvres for the bell tower at the church. Ricker Olson, Phil White and Greg will be helping with the installation when Buckley Reynolds can bring their ladder truck over to assist for the height. Roman Glinwood reported that he was working on the landscaping around the church, and installing an automatic watering system with a timer, which will run for 1 1/2 to 2 hours until the weather cools down.

Standing reports were given next: the secretary's

report of the minutes from the May meeting were accepted as read, motioned by Sharon Wolske, and seconded by Meagan Malchow. The Treasurer's Report was approved, and motion to accept was made by Meagan, and seconded by Sharon. The report from the Call Committee was read, and showed that the intern, Keith Weatherford will be starting at

our church in August. An Orientation meeting will be held, and an intern committee will be formed to discuss salary, etc. The motion to form the group was made by Liz, and seconded by Meagan, and passed. The committee will consist of Jill, Liz, Dawn, and Kristianne. Additional members will be recruited to join as well. Liz reported she had lay pastors lined up through July for doing services at Emmanuel.

Worship services will begin to return to former practices for communion and worship. The mask mandate has been lifted, and Bishop Jungling has said we should use our own judgement with seating, etc. Communion will be done at the communion rail, as before, beginning July 25th. A decision regarding the passing of the offering plate was not made as yet. Furniture, doorknobs, handrails will all be sanitized as we have been doing. It was also decided to add pictures of our new landscape around the church, and the garden area to our website. Greg and Ricker will set the date for the louvres to be installed in the bell tower, when it is convenient for all. The proposed quote on the furnace and thermostat was tabled for now.

Council Appointments for August and September include a Youth Committee consisting of Liz, Greg and Jill; a Music Committee and Director will be handled monthly by Dawn Sherseth and Liz. and the Treasurer's position is still handled by both Sharon and Robin, and it is going well, and may begin using a version of Quick Books.

New Business: Laura Vanberg is updating the church directory and the file is on the computer. An offering for the prison ministries will be held through the month of June, and a basket for that is in the back of the church. August 1st will be combined church services in the Huntley Park. August 8th we will have the induction and celebration of the intern, Keith Weatherford. It was decided to have summer BBQ's again, and

we will just have two each month, of July and August, and they will be held on Thursday evenings, July 8th and 22nd, and August 5th and 19th, We will need volunteers to help with that project.

A possible garage sale was suggested, but no decision made on that as yet. Robin McCaffree asked about

the "Gather" magazine, and whether it should be renewed. It will be renewed for another year.

Information for our Congregations



To: Campers/Guests registered for Christikon in 2021

Re: Camp Preparation & Travel

We're thankful for the progress made in the Covid fight, that we know much more about how it spreads than we did last season, and that all staff received vaccine before arriving for the summer. While we aren't fully back to "normal" conditions, vaccines are widely available for anyone 12 and up in most, if not all, areas of the country. We continue to strongly encourage everyone who can to get the shot before coming to camp.

In consultation with our camp physician and county health director, this is the latest update regarding Covid 19:

Guest/Group Preparation and Travel:

- Quarantine unnecessary if all group members fully vaccinated
- For those not vaccinated, we ask them to limit outside contact in the 10 days prior to leaving for Christikon
- We suggest groups limit contact while in route (i.e. rest stops over convenience stores, ordering food to overnight lodging rather than eating out, etc.). Again for groups fully vaccinated, they can travel more freely

While at Christikon, some protocols remain:

- hand washing/sanitizing stations in place before each meal
- cabin bunks remain further apart and all cabins equipped with ventilation fans
- most activities and programming done outdoors
- all will mask when singing at worship
- we'll continue limited our practice of joining hands during meal and worship prayer

Remember to pray for the staff and campers.
