Council Meeting - July 13, 2022

The Church Council met Wednesday evening, July 13th, at 7:30 PM. Members present were Greg Plath, Ricker Olson, Jill Hoffman, Liz White, Robin McCaffree, Vicar Keith, Sharon Wolske and Dawn Petty Dawn did the opening devotions.

Standing Reports included the minutes from the last meeting, which were approved as corrected, the motion was made by Robin, seconded by Sharon. Lindsey gave the treasurer's report and that also was

approved, motion made by Liz, seconded by Sharon. The Intern Committee Report included a plan to have a celebration in honor of Vicar Keith, following services, as the 31st of July will be the culmination of his term here at Emmanuel.

The Call Committee Update included a review of the meeting with Pastor Josh and Hardin church members. No decision was made at this time, as to whether we would share the Pastor with the Hardin Church. Many things need to be considered, as to change of service times, etc. on a part time contract.

The Youth Committee consisting of Jill, Greg and Liz will meet in late August. The Bibles ordered for the children have arrived. Vacation Bible School was held on June 27th to the 29th, and all went well. The Music Committee (consisting of Jill and Vicar Keith) have musicians lined up and scheduled through October...and there still is a plan to have some special music during that period.

OLD BUSINESS: The summer BBQs are doing well. There are few volunteers signed up to help with the preparations, etc. Should we continue without more help? It was discussed and decided we would go on with the BBQ's. The new signs are attractive, and good advertising for the events. The cost to have them produced were \$392.00. The Community

Garden update reported some hail damage to some of the vegetables and flowers. Ricker reported that the grapevines don't seem to be growing very well, perhaps due to the soil type in the area.

The New Member class and induction (Living Lutheran class) is going very well, and they are having some good discussions. Laura Vanberg will be updating the Military wall, with some assistance.

NEW BUSINESS: We reviewed our offerings and attendance and were happy to see growth in both. We received a special thank you from the ELCA for the \$2500.00 sent to them for our response to the

We also will need to update our church directory. We need to have a meeting of the congregation to discuss the option of hiring a part time minister, Pastor Josh, and sharing him with the Hardin church. We need to discuss which days he would be here at Shepherd, other than the Sunday

Our worship time may have to be changed to 8:45AM some weeks, and at 11:15 AM for a time, to allow him travel time in between the two churches. We will have a special council meeting at 3:00 PM on Sunday afternoon, the 24th.

Sunday Service Attendants: offering counters: July 17th will be Sharon, July 24th will be Jill, July 31st will be Robin, the August 7th we will be meeting at Barkmeyer Park with the other congregations for our joint annual worship, and then offering counter for Aust 14th will be Dawn. Our next Council meeting will be held on August 10th, at 7:00 PM, at Emmanuel Lutheran Church.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.



CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING - July 24, 2022

The Council held a special meeting on Sunday afternoon, July 24th, at 3:00 PM to decide on hiring Pastor Josh Wyman as a part time basis, sharing him with American Lutheran Church in Hardin. Discussion included a different time for our Sunday worship, either being 8:45 AM or 11:15 AM, as he would need the time to travel between the churches. Greg Plath made a motion to evaluate the new schedule quarterly, and if it isn't working out, we could opt out of the contract, and it was seconded by Liz White, and it was passed. Our share of his salary would be between \$35,000 to \$42,000 annually. His official starting date will be September 4th at 8:00 AM, and his weekly office hours would be Wednesday and Thursday here at Emmanuel. Robin, Ricker, and Jill will work out the terms of his contract.

The need for air conditioning in church was discussed, and Buckley will explore options and prices for obtaining that system. The meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.

As we conclude and celebrate the year long internship with Vicar Keith, our little country church will be starting a new Pastoral journey. On behalf of the church council, we would like to thank all of you for your comments, questions and feedback sessions. The church council has voted to extend a contract to Pastor Josh Wyman and work on a shared relationship with First American Lutheran Church of Hardin. Over the coming weeks a core group of council members will work on the contract details and sharing logistics. We will send additional information to communicate the upcoming changes. During the month of Aust, we will continue our 10am worship service with Lay Pastoral Associates and expect changes to the worship time in September.
