EMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING September 14, 2022

The Council met Wednesday evening at Liz White's residence. Members present were Jill, Liz, Ricker, Dawn, Pastor Josh, Lindsey, Buckley and Robin. Jill opened the meeting with devotions.

Standing Reports: Phil and Liz White gave the report on the condition of the water at the church. There have been numerous problems with the water, including difficulties with the soaker hose, the water being contaminated, and

with the faucets. Robin made a motion, seconded by Liz, to replace the units and update the system, and the motion was passed. The secretary's report was approved, motion made by Liz, seconded by Robin. Lindsey gave the Treasurer's report, showing that expenses for the summer were lower, as were the offerings, and the attendance. Lindsey had re-done all of the previous monthly reports, and

there were no bills for the cemetery mowing, etc. Buckley made the motion to accept the Treasurer's report, and it was seconded by Liz, and passed.

The Call Committee report gave the details of hiring Pastor Josh Wyman, as part-time pastor.

The Youth Committee reported that the acolytes are continuing to help with the services.

Instructions for "1st"Communion are being held also.

The Music Committee has musicians scheduled through March, at this time. As we are paying the other musicians, the question was brought up, should we be paying the Sherseth group, and that was agreed upon.

OLD BUSINESS: The Community Garden has been watered regularly, along with the vineyard. It was determined that there needs to be 2 to 3 hours of watering done per week.

The contract with Pastor Josh Wyman will be for services beginning at 8:45 AM here at Emmanuel.

Liz White will get help from Colter and Jim McKinney on technology issues. A new camera

is needed to continue to download our services, and some new wiring also.

Buckley reported on the air conditioning needed for summer months, and he will continue to work on that and update the system.

NEW BUSINESS: We will be holding the Harvest Dinner and Bazaar on the 1st Sunday in November, which is the 6<sup>th</sup>. Plans are already in the works for that event.

There will be a new member induction in January.

Since we have not sent our contribution of \$4000.00 to the Montana Synod, it was voted on to do so, by Robin, seconded by Liz, and motion was passed.

The Town Pump will match funds for the food pantry for the months of through November.

Ricker said he will be ordering new grape vines for the vineyard for \$100.00. Liz motioned to approve that, seconded by Buckley, and passed.

SUNDAY SERVICE ATTENDANTS: offering counters; Jill will do September 18<sup>th</sup>, Dawn will do the 25<sup>th</sup>, Ricker will count on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of October, Liz on the 9<sup>th</sup> of October, and Dawn on the 16<sup>th</sup>.

Our next council meeting will be on October 12<sup>th</sup> at the church at 7:00 PM.

### Activities and information




