14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. 15 Rejoice with those who rejoice; weep with those who weep. 16 Live in harmony with one another; do not be arrogant, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. 17 Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. 18 If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. 19 Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine; I will repay, says the Lord." 20 Instead, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink, for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads." 21 Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

-Romans 12:14-21

Over the past few months, we have once again been surrounded by signs and slogans, debates and opinions, all urging us to pick a side. This year, it feels like the divisions in our country are especially deep, with each side feeling more certain of their perspective and, perhaps, more frustrated by those who see things differently. We're surrounded by messages that tell us to defend our "side" and to view those who disagree as not just wrong, but as somehow lesser or even enemies. In times like these, how do we, as followers of Christ, strive for something different?

Romans 12:14-21 speaks directly to times like these. Paul invites us to live with humility, compassion, and a commitment to peace. His words don't ask us to give up our convictions or ignore injustices; rather, they encourage us to approach every person, even those we struggle to understand, with grace. "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with

everyone," he writes. Imagine if this became our aim: not to change each other's minds, but simply to treat one another with respect and kindness.

Paul continues, "Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone." This doesn't mean agreeing with everything we hear or giving up what we believe. Instead, it calls us to respond to hostility not with anger, but with compassion and integrity. In our conversations, in our social media posts, and around our own dinner tables, we can model what it means to listen with patience, to disagree without resentment, and to speak with respect.

This kind of harmony isn't easy, and it doesn't mean we'll always see eye to eye. But within our church family and beyond, our unity in Christ is a powerful testimony. Harmony is possible not because we agree on every issue but because we choose love over winning an argument and relationship over being right.

At the end of Romans 12, Paul continues, "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." In this season, when we're often asked to dwell on the faults of others, perhaps we can find a different way forward by focusing on kindness and compassion. Each small choice we make to treat one another with grace, each time we choose peace over conflict, is a witness to the love of Christ.

As we approach Election Day and the days that follow, let us hold fast to our faith, trusting that God is with us and in control, no matter the outcome. And let's ask Him to help us be people of peace and unity, pursuing harmony not by changing minds but by extending love and understanding to everyone we encounter.
