This summer, we're setting out on a journey. Not just to reflect on where we've been, but to look ahead with open hearts and renewed imagination.

We believe that God is always doing a new thing. Planting seeds of grace in our midst, calling us into deeper relationships, and nudging us toward bold acts of love and service. Our job as a congregation isn't to have it all figured out. Our job is to stay open, stay listening, and stay ready to follow where the Spirit leads.

That's exactly what our upcoming series, "**Who Are We Becoming?**", is all about.

Starting June 15th, over the course of six Sundays, we'll explore some of the most important questions a church can ask:

What is the Church meant to be?

What values and hopes shape our life together?

What future is God inviting us to help create in this time and place?

These aren't questions with easy or one-size-fits-all answers. But they're essential questions for a church in motion, a church discerning its next faithful step. Our hope is that by the end of this series, we'll begin to see more clearly who we are becoming and where our shared gifts, passions, and stories might be leading us next.

To guide us, we'll be spending time in two powerful books of Scripture: the Book of Acts and the letter to the Philippians. *Acts* invites us to walk with the earliest believers as they form a Spirit-filled community shaped by courage, generosity, and faith in action. *Philippians* brings us into Paul's joyful, pastoral heart—a vision of church rooted in love, humility, and partnership in the gospel.

This series follows a liturgy of becoming; a rhythm of prayer, proclamation, and communal listening that invites us to grow in faith and clarity together.

- **First, we reflect.** At the beginning of each week, we'll share a short set of guiding questions to take home. These questions are meant to stir your thinking and praying, whether privately, around the dinner table, or during a quiet walk with God.
- **Next, we worship.** Each Sunday's sermon will draw from Acts and Philippians to engage that week's question. We'll listen for what Scripture might be saying to us right now; about who we are, what we value, and what we're becoming.
- **Finally, we gather in conversation.** After worship, we'll hold a more intentional time of shared reflection during coffee hour. These conversations will give space to name what we're hearing and seeing—both individually and as a community. They'll help us recognize shared threads, discover new insights, and begin imagining where the Spirit might be leading us next.

We don't have to have all the answers to begin this journey. All we need is a willingness to listen, to Scripture, to one another, and to the quiet promptings of the Spirit. Let's walk this road together with courage, curiosity, and hope. I can't wait to see what we'll discover, together.



Standing reports:

Secretary Report – Abbey will amend last month’s minutes. April’s meeting minutes should have included that the council will be seeking outside help from two companies. The goal of this out-reach will be to move towards financial stability and more unity within our congregation and council members. More information to come.
