Jesus' final words to his followers were not about waiting, but about going. About stepping into the world, trusting that God would lead them to the places where love was most needed. That same calling rests with you. The Spirit is ahead of you, drawing you forward into the work of love, justice, and compassion.

So keep going. Keep gathering. Keep following where God's Spirit leads, even when the next step feels uncertain. Trust that the God who has been faithful to this church will remain faithful still.

Thank you for the ways you have lived this calling already. Thank you for the laughter, the prayers, the hope you have shared, and the ways you have shown Christ's love in this community. The Spirit has done beautiful work through you, and I have no doubt that God will continue to do even more. Thank you for letting me be a part of your ministry.

May you go with confidence, knowing that the one who calls you is faithful. And may God's Spirit keep leading you to love boldly, to serve freely, and to walk always in grace.

Greetings, Friends and Neighbors,

A special big thank you to all the people who worked on the Church Garden this year. It was beautifully done and a blessing to so many people. Now it is time to think about the holidays coming up, and our customary Thanksgiving Baskets for those families in need. This is a joint project with Emmanuel Church and the Shepherd Lions Club to provide the food baskets. There is a sign-up sheet in the food pantry for community families needing a basket. Items to be collected for the baskets include gravy mixes, canned green beans, canned cranberries, instant potatoes, stuffing, carrots, pickles, and cans of condensed cream of chicken, onion, or mushroom soups, and cool whip for the pies. 10/14/25 Shepherd Emmanuel Lutheran Church Council

Present: Pastor Josh, Sam Murnion, Devin (via speaker phone), Jill, Carol, Lindsey, Jack, Dawn, Jeanne, and Abbey

Called to order at 7PM

Agenda presented by Sam. Pastor Josh led devotion with Phillipians Chapter 1, 3-6.

Standing reports:

Secretary Report – with the amendment emailed last month from Kristianne, report was approved. (Jill/Carol)

Treasurer Report – Spoke about splitting out what is coming in for the building fund/insurance and we had previously talked about starting another account just for the new issues and damage. Lindsey advised that the money is already in the current building fund and that it was being kept separate. Part of the issue with the propane usage that we talked about in the last meeting was a cracked hose found on the propane connection coupler. We leaked a lot of propane and will have to have another fill soon. The fix was made and we will also need to level the tank at some time. Report was approved. (Carol/Dawn)

Pastoral Report – Pastor Josh and his family have accepted a new call to Wisconsin. He explained things to the board with a heartfelt message. His last service at our church will be 11/9 but the official last date will be Friday 11/14. Announcement will be made in church 10/19. Call committee will be formed to assist with the transition. Jill and Jeanne will be on that call committee and start working to fill the church responsibilities such as confirmation and the substitute pastors. The council is heartbroken but excited for them to get back closer to their families. Pastor Josh was excited and although this will leave a hole in our congregation, we are excited for him and his family! This move is God's plan for them!

Youth Committee – Morning youth Bible study, adult Bible study, and confirmation will continue and we will work hard as a council to fill in where we can. Confirmation will be the obvious priority but the council, with Pastor Josh's lead, will find a way to keep that going.

Music Committee – No updates

Old business:

Storm/insurance update: We received a payment of \$104K. Latest update will be \$158K with the adjustments. They are not covering the steeple metal because we did not have proof of replacement from the work done in 2019. The contractor estimated the steeple replacement at \$32K. Some of the back and forth with the current insurance company is the quality vs. insurance amounts they are willing to pay. The 158K will cover the siding, roof, windows, and the gutters. The contractor's bid is \$180K which shorts us aprox. \$15K. A tough discussion started about maybe starting all over with a new building. Jill made a motion to expand the building committee to get three different options to get some basic sketches/costs to compare to what we have now and as what we can do to move forward. 1 - Fix the building and restore what we have. 2 - Complete minimum fixes with a secondary fellowship

building. 3 - Build a completely separate and new building to incorporate both the sanctuary and the fellowship. (Jill/Jack) Sam will work with the insurance angle to also bid each of the above 3 options with an insurance cost for each of them. The insurance is a big issue with the old building! We are very concerned that the insurance that will not carry us again with the two claims in 2019 and 2025. Abbey will work up a basic sketch/plan for the 3 different options and then present it to Sam to see if she can then work the insurance angle on all three options. Once those bids are in place, we will move forward to getting realistic bids and then present the finings to the congregation. We need prayers to be guided to making good decisions for the future of our church.

Coaching: Lindsey suggests that we hire a company to "coach our leaders". Her opinion is that with all of the changes, we really need to move towards focusing on the future of our church. Group consensus is that we need help to figure out our "future" to include a new pastor, new building/repairs on the existing building, and few new board members. The coaching would provide clarity. Josh Landrum with Harvest Church was one of the coaches that the council reached out to in May. Lindsey made a motion to hire Chad for a 3 month "strategic reset" option to see what he could help us with. The money will come from our savings account. (Lindsey/Jill)

Welcome bags: Jill has handed out two welcome bags in October. Some information about our church, some fun things like homemade Dawn Jelly, prayer squares, among other items are included. Kristianne presented (via Jack) her idea for the "Connect Card". Kristianne provided a rough draft of her ideas and the council approved. She and Jack will get these printed and they will be distributed in the pews of the church. "Connect Cards" will be a great way for visitors or newer members to get more involved or give them the opportunity to request more information.

Youth/Community Event for Fall/Winter months tabled due to the storm damage.

Spoke about the fall Harvest Dinner. Postpone it? Change it? Re-invent it? Turned over the planning to the ELCW.

New Business:

Nominating Committee – 2025 Council: President/Sam staying on. VP/Carol leaving and the VP position will be open. Treasurer/Lindsey leaving the position but staying on the council. Secretary/Abbey staying on. Representatives/Jill, Jeanne, Devin, Jack, and Kristianne all staying on. Dawn will also stay on the council but as of now in an undefined roll. TO BE FILLED: Vice President, Treasurer, and one representative.


